Monday, January 27 – 5:45PM Mass to Commemorate the 80th Anniversary of the Liberation of German Nazi Concentration and Extermination Camp. Both St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross and St. Maximilian Kolbe were martyred in Auschwitz: Saint Maximilian Kolbe was martyred on August 14, 1941 in the German Nazi concentration camp of Auschwitz; Saint Teresa Benedicta was martyred on August 9, 1942 in a gas chamber in Auschwitz. Light refreshments to follow. *(Note – the 5:45PM Mass at St. Teresa will be the only daily Mass in Dearborn County on this day.)*

Thursday, January 30 – Parish Anniversary Date; Archbishop Daniel M. Beuchlein formerly established Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross as a parish of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis in 2000. Mark this day by personal prayers of thanksgiving for God's faithfulness.
